Historical Nugget: Mrs. Ezra DeForest: A WCUM Founder & Longtime Treasurer

On October 4, 2025, the Woman's Club of Upper Montclair will be 125 years old. During this quasquicentennial year, I will be writing about the founders of our club. Given our current economic times, it is appropriate to begin this article series with the DeForests. Mrs. Ezra DeForest (Mary Gordon Wilbur), was born on August 25, 1854, in Boston, Massachusetts, the daughter of Dr. Joshua G. Wilbur, a former Civil War surgeon, and Martha E. Plummer Wilbur. She served 25 years as WCUM Treasurer until stepping down in 1926 to be succeeded by Mrs. William H. Areson. Some interesting WCUM club financial trivia from the 1924 - 1925 Treasurer's Report ... Electricity & Gas: \$360.77 (club year); Heating (Coal): \$1, 601.12 (club year); Insurance: \$3, 339.23 (club year); Taxes & Assessments: \$1, 299.20 (club year); Telephone: \$88.03 (club year); Montclair Bureau of Water Supply: \$34.78 (club year).

In 1880 Mary married Colonel Ezra DeForest. Her husband was born February 7, 1851, in Bridgeport, Connecticut. Colonel DeForest served with distinction for 25 years in the 23rd Regiment of the NY National Guard, and was honorably discharged in April 1898. For many years he was a Trustee of the Penn Mutual (insurance) Association.

In the latter 1880s the DeForest family moved from Brooklyn, NY, to Montclair to live on property purchased by her father as the family summer residence. The DeForest home was located at 465 Valley Road which in 1925 included 8 acres bounded by Valley Rd, Northview Ave, Park St & Gordonhurst Ave. This house was adjacent to the former 1685 "Dutch" homestead (no longer extant). Joseph Sigler is reputed to have purchased the 1685 land for 10 cows and 3 horses. The DeForests settled into community life with Colonel DeForest being elected as a Trustee of the Christian Union Congregation Church in 1899.

On April 5, 1921, Colonel DeForest died by suicide (jumped from 3rd floor window) at his Montclair home. The Rev. Jay T. Stocking presided at his funeral, and spoke eloquently about Ezra's gentleness, kind spirit, and his uprightness. Penn Mutual colleagues and others spoke well of him, including his old-school manners. Family mentioned that he was mentally challenged by health problems and a bad business venture. Mrs. DeForest died at her home on November 20, 1944, aged 90 years. She was survived by two daughters, Miss Helen DeForest and Mrs. Charles E. Cole of Montclair, and four grandchildren. ~ Pat Piermatti, Historian

Did You Know...?

MEDICARE OPEN ENROLLMENT

October marks the beginning of Open Enrollment for those whose medical benefits are provided through the Medicare program. If you have questions or concerns about your medical coverage The State Health Insurance Assistance Program (SHIP) in Essex County, New Jersey, provides free, objective, and confidential help to Medicare beneficiaries with questions or problems about their health insurance, including Medicare, Medigap, Medicare Advantage plans, Part D, and long-term care insurance. The Essex County Division of Senior Services is the primary point of contact for services related to seniors and adults with disabilities, but SHIP counselors are available throughout the county and also offer virtual services.

Key Points about SHIP in Essex County:

Free and Objective Help:

SHIP counselors do not sell or recommend specific insurance products, agents, or companies.

• Wide Range of Information:

SHIP counselors assist with questions about Medicare, Medigap, Medicare Advantage, Part D, and long-term care insurance.

Community Access:

SHIP counselors are available at various locations throughout Essex County, including libraries and community centers.
