## HISTORICAL NUGGET: "Birth Control, Margaret Sanger"

This month's "Historical Nugget" grew from a local history fact mentioned on television. While watching a "Story Television" program, I heard that in 1882/83 Julius Schmid, a German immigrant, formed a company which manufactured condoms at a plant in Little Fall, NJ. Schmid Laboratories manufactured not only condoms, but also toiletries and toothpaste. In the late 1970s condom manufacture moved to Georgia and in the latter 1990s to Alabama. A 1987 New York Times article stated that "... 95% of the condoms sold in the U.S. ... are made by New Jersey based companies." And, speaking of condoms ... that lead me to think of birth control & then the work of Margaret Sanger.

Margaret was born in Corning, NY in 1879, the 6th of 11 children in an Irish Catholic family. Margaret's early life must have been difficult as her father was an alcoholic and her mother, who had 7 miscarriages, died at age 49. In 1902, Margaret married Mr. William Sanger an architect and they eventually settled in Greenwich Village. Mrs. Sanger practiced obstetrical nursing and gave sex education talks to many women, notwithstanding their race or economic standing.

On Wednesday, January 20, 1926, Mrs. Sanger, then President of the Birth Control League of America, spoke at WCUM on the topic "National and International Aspects of Birth Control." Margaret had spoken to

New Jersey women before. On Sunday, November 23, 1924 she gave a lecture before the Montclair Unity Forum audience on the topic of "Population and Civilization." On January 14, 1926 she spoke at a public meeting held at the Hotel Walt Whitman in Camden. A birth control bill was to be considered by the NJ legislature that month and many NJSFWC clubs were having programs on the topic. An additional NJ speaking engagement was held January 1926 at a hidden location in Silver Lake, NJ (Camden area) for the women's group of the KKK. Biographical sources say that Mrs. Sanger was not a member or proponent of the KKK. However, this group and other groups such as eugenicists contributed to much controversy during Sanger's life and afterwards. Her work in later years included establishing the International Planned Parenthood Federation in 1952, recruiting Gregory Pincus to work on development of "the pill", and getting Katherine McCormick, the International Harvester heiress to fund this research project. Mrs. Sanger died on September 6, 1966 in Tucson, Arizona.
