We are happy to inform you that the Clubhouse's traditional monthly Monday Games Day is back, on the second Monday of every month.



HISTORICAL NUGGET:

"Shopping, Advertisements, and our Club Bulletin"

As the lazy, hazy days of summer wane, shopping for back to school or to refresh tired fashions in our closets, or to redecorate or update an appliance is a popular activity. While thinking about this column, I happened upon a news article about the Westfield Garden State Plaza. The mall owner Unibail-Rodamco-Westfield (Paris, France) plans to sell the mall as part of its plan to divest U.S. properties. After moving to Clifton in 1955, this mall was the first my parents and I frequented. We all have rediscovered the value of shopping locally and supporting local businesses. A Montclair Times article from 1878 mentions the underrated Montclair industries of vegetable farms and berry gardens ... Cooper Avenue was known for the latter. Eating locally grown or raised produce and meats is not a new concept.

October is a birthday month for our club publication, The Bulletin of the Woman's Club of Upper Montclair. During the early years of our club, communication about club activities and events was in an informal newsletter format. For October 1925, as part of the 25th Anniversary, club communications were upgraded to a magazine format with printing on glossy paper. Paid advertisements were solicited to cover expenses. Quoting from this October 1925 issue, "This Bulletin, like the old one, is free to

all Club members (1200 in 1925) ... Much care has been exercised to make the publication one of which the Club will be proud, both in contents and in appearance ... Club activities naturally will be given prominence ... calendar of events ... news of the State and National Federations and of other clubs will frequently be given"

Paid "Bulletin" ads varied in size and page position as they do in many publications today. Creativity in corporate names is evident in this October issue. For example, "F. A. Cutter & Co. Tree Experts," "The Jack and Jill Shop, Children's and Baby Things," and "H.W. Covert Co., Fireplace Fittings." Other ads of interest in this issue included "Madame Mildred Specialty Shop ... Better Grade of Women's Wear for Sport and Dress ... Betty Wales Dresses and Knox Hats", "Cecile Corcoran Hair Dressing Parlor ... Children's Hair Cutting", "The Silhouette Coffee Shop" and "Ye Canterbury Gift Shoppe." Although our beloved "Bulletin" has reverted to a simpler format, keeping our members informed and excited about each new Club year has not.
