Wishing you a Happy Spring and Happy Easter.



CONGRATULATIONS, JOANN APONTE!

JoAnn Aponte will be honored by the NJSFWC for her years of services to various clubs within the Liberty District. This year marks her 50th anniversary of serving as a volunteer. While she has received many awards and recognitions throughout the years, perhaps the most prestigious was the Cecilia Gaines Holland Award, the highest honor bestowed upon a New Jersey Clubwoman. Named after the second president of the NJSFWC, the award is presented annually to one clubwoman who demonstrates her commitment by performing outstanding civic and volunteer work that extended above and beyond her service to her club. JoAnn received that award in 2011 when she was nominated by the Woman's Club of Maplewood, Liberty District



where she was a member. Throughout the years, JoAnn has held many positions, served on numerous committees, but those closest to her heart are those dedicated to women, children and veterans. Thank you, JoAnn!

HISTORICAL NUGGET:

"John Charles Thomas & Madeleine Brard 1925 Recital at WCUM"

One hundred years ago, on January 6, 1925 at 8:15 p.m. the famous baritone, John Charles Thomas performed at our clubhouse in a joint recital with pianist Madeleine Brard, the prix d'honeur artist of the Paris Conservatory. This affair was the second in a series of entertainments given by WCUM to benefit the clubhouse building fund. The auditorium of the new clubhouse with its near perfect acoustics enhanced audience appreciation of Mr. Thomas's vocal range from falsetto notes to powerful lower tones.

Born September 6, 1891 in Meyersdale, PA, Thomas was a successful opera, operetta and concert baritone. His father was a Methodist minister of Welsh descent and his mother of German descent had been an amateur singer. Thomas studied at the Peabody Institute in Baltimore, spent some time in Europe improving his singing technique and in 1934 made his Metropolitan Opera debut playing Germont in Verdi's La Traviata. His performance at WCUM was well received by those fortunate enough to have navigated their way through bad traffic conditions. He died December 13, 1960 in Apple Valley, CA.
